Regular Council Meeting  
September 14, 2020

Mayor Armstrong called the meeting to order at 6:31 PM with the following council members present; Greg Gentry, Sandra Hockenbury, Daniel Dooley, Mike Holt, Troy Barr and Gayle Troutman.

Also present were City Attorney Hayden Sweat, City Administrator Dawn Hardin, City Treasurer Alice Harris, Chief Troy Pitcock and Public Works Director Ronnie Fick.

The Mayor stated there are several in attendance tonight and said with the social distancing in place in the event that we are not able to continue to safely social distance we have to adjourn the meeting and schedule a special meeting.

Mayor Armstrong reminded anyone wanting to speak to please sign in at the podium.

Councilman Dooley led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Armstrong asked those present to take a moment of reflection.

**Audit for fiscal year end June 2019.**

Simon Keemer presented the City of Mt. Washington Audit findings for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019. (A complete Copy of the Audit can be viewed in the office of the City Clerk) Councilman Holt made and Councilman Dooley seconded a motion. Motion carried by a roll call vote of 6 to 0.

**Minutes**

Councilwoman Hockenbury made and Councilman Holt seconded a motion to approve the minutes of the regular council meeting for August 24, 2020. Motion carried.

**Police Report**

Chief Pitcock read the police Report for the month of August 2020.

Councilman Gentry commended a Police Officer for his efforts in interacting with youth in his neighborhood.

Mayor Armstrong mentioned to the Chief of reports of bullying or possible threatening in the park.

**Ordinance (s)**

Councilman Barr stated he understands everyone’s compassion and concerns on this zoning request, he wants to inform everyone he has been in contact with the Judge Executive and has committed to improve counties roads that have multiple subdivisions on them. He said this is going to be in a five-year plan and that roads will be addressed to improve traffic flow.

**SECOND READING – VOTE REQUIRED**

Attorney Sweat read the second reading relating to the rezoning request from AG to R-3 Residential of 49.8704 acres more or less owned by James Jewell located at 1110 Bethel Church Road. Councilman Barr made and Councilman Holt seconded a motion to accept the recommendations of Bullitt County Planning and Zoning. Motion carried by a roll call vote of 4 to 2 abstaining (Hockenbury, Gentry).

**SECOND READING – VOTE REQUIRED**

Hayden Sweat read a statement for clarification of the amendment. The City Attorney read the second reading of an ordinance amending certain sections of Chapter 121: Mobile Food Unit Vendors. Councilman Gentry made a motion to approve and Councilman Holt seconded the motion. Motion carried by a roll call vote of 6 to 0.

**SECOND READING- VOTE REQUIRED**

Hayden Sweat read the second reading establishing the Motor Vehicle tax rate for the calendar year 2021 and providing for collection. Councilman Dooley made a motion to approve and Councilman Gentry seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously by a roll call vote.

**FIRST READING SPONSORED BY COUNCILMAN**

An ordinance establishing the real and property tax rate for the calendar year 2020 and providing for collection.

Matthew Marcum a resident in Autumn Glen presented a pool enclosure for approval of the city council in accordance with chapter 150.06. Councilman Barr made a motion to approve the proposal as submitted and Councilman Troutman seconded. Motion carried.

Hunter Harp reiterated his concerns with the ordinance amendment regarding Mobile Food Truck requirements for Mt. Washington.

Patrisha Milby an Autumn Glen resident spoke on Mobile Food Truck Vendors and provided her opinion why they are important.
