Regular Council Meeting
October 12, 2020

Mayor Armstrong called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM with the following council members present; Troy Barr, Greg Gentry, Sandra Hockenbury, Daniel Dooley and Mike Holt. Councilman Troutman was absent.

Also present were City Attorney Hayden Sweat, City Administrator Dawn Hardin, City Treasurer Alice Harris, Chief Troy Pitcock and City Engineer Dave Derrick.

Mayor Armstrong reminded anyone wanting to speak to please sign in at the podium.

Councilman Holt led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Armstrong asked those present to take a moment of reflection.

Minutes

Councilman Gentry made and Councilman Dooley seconded a motion to approve the minutes of the regular council meeting for September 28, 2020. Motion carried.

Police Report

Chief Pitcock read the police report for the month of September 2020. Councilman Barr sked the Chief the number of Parking tickets that has been issued so far this year. The Chief stated there have only been one parking ticket issued back to January.

Councilman Gentry commended the MWPD for their efforts in assisting LMPD during the protesting in Louisville, KY.

Mayor Armstrong read a Proclamation for declaring October 23, 2020 as Childhood Cancer Awareness Day. He also recognized a young man attending the meeting and his parents who are residents of Mt. Washington.

The Mayor recognized and read an article about Amanda Mathews, CEO of Prometheus Art, former resident of Mt. Washington. Her accomplishments Louisville, and Russellville Kentucky, include sculptures that have been recognized in New York City, Washington DC. The mayor also acknowledged her parents Jim and Brenda Matthews who were attending the meeting this evening.

The mayor urged everyone to continue to help prevent the spread of the COVID-19 as he reported that the Public Works Department in Richmond KY had to shut down due to

contamination of an employee. This cost the City of Richmond an upwards of \$500,000.00 to hire an engineering firm to come in and operate during this shut down.

Report from City Council
