Regular Council Meeting
April 11, 2022
Fick Hall**

Mayor Armstrong called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM with the following council members present, Sandra Hockenbury, Dustin Armstrong, Greg Gentry, Troy Barr, Albert Thompson, and George Maddox.

Also, present were City Attorney Hayden Sweat, Chief Tim Morris, and City Administrator Elizabeth Hardin.

Councilman Gentry led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Armstrong asked those present to take a moment of reflection.

Minutes

Councilwoman Hockenbury made, and Councilman Armstrong seconded a motion to approve the Regular Meeting Minutes for March 28, 2022. Motion carried.

Police Report

Chief Morris read the police report for the month of March 2022

Ordinance (s)

Second Reading - Vote Required

(A) Hayden Sweat read the second reading of an ordinance relating to the rezoning of 1.5074 acres owned by SBL Properties LLC from R-1 to B-2 Central Business located at 9750 Hwy 44 E. Councilman Maddox stated that the zoning change being requested is only on the 1.5074 acres. Councilman Gentry made a motion to accept the recommendation of Bullitt County Planning and Zoning and Councilman Armstrong seconded. Motion carried by a roll call vote of 4 in favor, 1 opposed (Hockenbury) and one abstention (Armstrong).

Mayor's Report

Mayor Armstrong stated he has appointed Steve Small to the Bullitt County Planning Board to fill a recent vacant position. Councilman Maddox made a motion and Councilman Thompson seconded to approve. Motion Carried.

Mayor Armstrong stated there will be a public hearing immediately following the Regular Council meeting on April 25, 2022, to discuss a roundabout at the intersection of North Bardstown Road and Landis Lane.

The Mayor said he would like the city to continue and seek out more grant opportunities for the city throughout each department within.

Mayor Armstrong recognized newly appointed Brian Anderson, Emergency Management who is attending the meeting tonight.

Report from the City Council

Councilman Maddox mentioned it has been brought to his attention that citizens cannot hear the tornado sirens and may want to address this for possible grants.
